If you or your family experiences a significant change in circumstances, the 2021-2022 FAFSA may no longer be an accurate reflection of your family's financial or household information.

The purpose of this appeal is to request an update to your FAFSA based on a documented change in circumstances. If the FAFSA update creates a change in financial aid eligibility, the financial aid package will be updated to reflect the change. Approved appeals may not result in an increase in financial aid.

Please include the required documents in your initial document submission. Students can submit this completed form and additional documents using the upload form.

Contact your assigned financial aid counselor to schedule a time to discuss your appeal.

Initial appeals must be submitted by April 1, 2022.

1. _____ Reduction of earned income

<u>Reasons for consideration include</u>: Terminations/Layoff from job, significant reduction of work hours, retirement, or leaving work to return to school full time.

<u>Suggested Documentation to Include</u>: This list is not exhaustive, please include documentation that supports the stated reason for your appeal and documents your reduction in income.

- Signed and dated letter from employer on company letterhead detailing the last date of employment
- The final pay stub from your last employer
- 2020 tax return transcript, 2020 signed 1040, and/or 2020 W-2(s), if your income was reduced in 2020
- 2021 W-2s

- Documentation of severance/benefits/unemployment compensation
- Copy of your most recent pay stub from current employers (include 3 most recent pay stubs, if the pay is variable)
- Documentation of start date of current employment (if applicable)
- Documentation of retirement income

_____ Recent unique medical expenses, not covered by insurance, which impact the ability to pay for college

<u>Reasons for consideration include</u>: Medical expenses paid, not just incurred, over a recent 12 month period <u>not</u> covered by health/dental insurance.

<u>Documentation to include</u>: Proof of payment (receipts/canceled checks) made by student and spouse, if married, or student and parent(s), if dependent. Invoices are not sufficient documentation – please include proof that the expenses were paid.

3. Loss of untaxed income

<u>Reasons for consideration include</u>: Loss of child support, disability benefits, or other untaxed income. <u>Documentation to include</u>: Documentation of termination of benefits from benefit provider. Other documentation, as applicable. Examples include a divorce decree, court order, etc.

4. _____ Separation or Divorce of: _____ Parent or _____Spouse after filing 2021-2022 FAFSA (Separation must be before 12/31/2021)

<u>Reasons for consideration include</u>: Parent (if dependent) or spouse (if independent) no longer residing in the household due to separations or divorce.

<u>Documentation to include</u>: All 2019 W-2's must be submitted to verify separation of income. Separation agreement, divorce decree, or substantial evidence (copy of mortgage/lease, utility bills, etc.) proving parent, if dependent, or spouse, if independent, is residing in separate residence. Parties in question living in the same dwelling cannot be considered.

5. _____ Student Marriage after filing 2021-2022 FAFSA (Marriage must be before 10/1/2021)

<u>Reasons for consideration include:</u> Student was single at the time they filed the FAFSA, but is now married. <u>Documentation to include:</u> Copy of marriage certificate, copy of spouse's 2019 tax return transcript or **signed** 1040, and copy of spouse's 2019 W-2's. Copy of 2019 IRS Statement of Non-filer letter (if spouse did not file a tax return in 2019).

6. _____ Death of: _____ Parent or _____Spouse after filing 2021-2022 FAFSA

Reasons for consideration include: Parent (if dependent) or spouse (if independent) deceased after student filed 2021-2022 FAFSA. Documentation to include: Copy of death certificate and documentation of death benefits.

7. _____ Parent of Dependent Student also attending college for 2021-2022 aid year

<u>Reasons for consideration include</u>: Parent of UMBC student is degree seeking at a post-secondary institution. Parent must be enrolled at least ½ time (usually 6 credits) in a degree seeking program and have been counted in the 2021-2022 FAFSA household size. Documentation to include: Official class schedule (copy) from parent's educational institution.
