

2022-2023 Dependency Appeal Request Form

What is a Dependency Appeal?

As outlined on the FAFSA, federal regulations define the criteria you must meet to be considered an independent student. If you do not meet any of the criteria, you can ask your school's financial aid office to re-evaluate your status. A dependency appeal is the process that a school uses to review your situation to determine if you are eligible to be considered as an independent student. This can only be done in certain **limited** and **exceptional** circumstances.

Please note: Federal guidelines state that the following situations are not considered "exceptional circumstances": 1) Your parent(s) is unwilling and/or is not able to financially support you 2) you live on your own and pay your own bills.

How does the process work?

Each institution is required to establish its own policies in regards to granting dependency appeals. This means you can receive a dependency appeal approval from one school, but may not receive one from the next school that you attend.

The Appeals Committee will do an initial review of the information that you submit within 2 weeks of receipt. They will notify you of your status by email. Failure to provide requested documentation may result in a delay or a denial of your appeal. In addition, the Appeals Committee may need to request additional documentation to support your appeal or may need to contact your references; sometimes the committee may request that you come in for a personal interview. Please keep in mind that the review process can take 6-8 weeks to complete.

Documents and information collected to support your appeal will remain confidential and are used to determine your eligibility for financial aid assistance. However; if the Committee finds that you intentionally made false statements or misrepresentations, your request will be cancelled and may be referred to Judicial Services for further review.

How do I apply for an appeal?

Complete the attached form and submit all requested documentation. You should monitor your myUMBC email account – the Appeals Committee will send all correspondence to you regarding your request to your UMBC email account.

What else do I need to know?

Completion of this form and submission of documents **does not guarantee** approval of a dependency appeal. Approval of an appeal **does not guarantee** receipt of additional aid. You are responsible for all outstanding bills with UMBC and should make arrangements to ensure that your bill is paid by the due date. **Please note: If you are approved for a dependency appeal, your dependency status must be reevaluated each year until you are automatically considered independent by federal criteria.**
